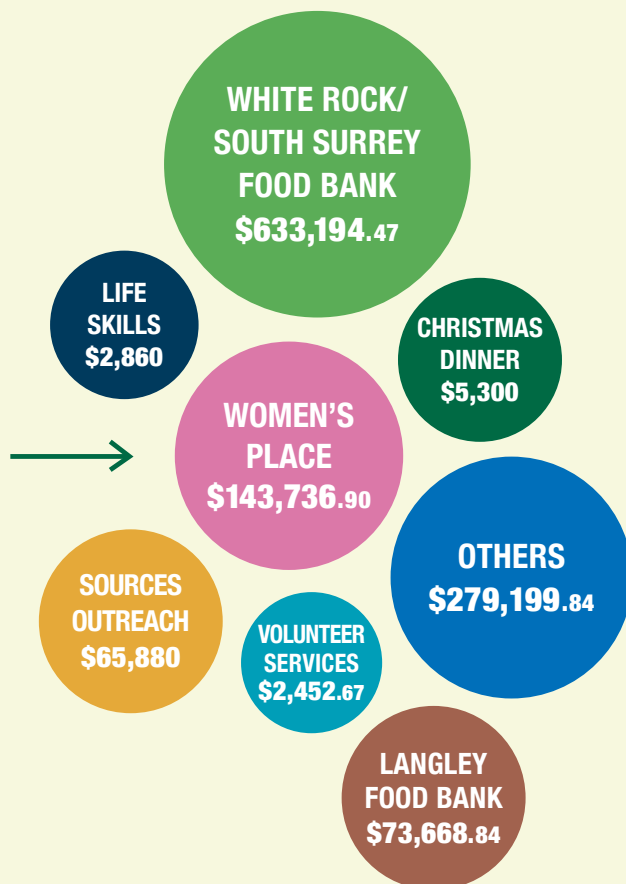
About Us

After 10 years without a place to call home, **Warren is settling into supported housing** and looking ahead with gratitude and hope

COMPASSION THAT CHANGES LIVES

Having seen how the streets and community change over the years, one donor developed deep empathy for people experiencing homelessness. His compassion is now helping hundreds of people in South Surrey/White Rock access the supports they need. Through his fundraising leadership, advocacy work, community engagement and

generous financial support, he helped bring the Homeless Outreach Program to life.

What began as a shared vision to help people experiencing homelessness has grown into a vital community service, connecting vulnerable individuals with housing, healthcare and other life-changing supports.

Impact in Action

60+ unsheltered individuals secured housing

400+ accessed medical care from a physician or nurse that they may not otherwise have received

70+ medical procedures or treatments were completed

30+ individuals obtained replacement identification after their IDs were lost or stolen

~20 received support filing taxes, enabling access to financial and medical benefits

15+ individuals participated in substance use counselling

10+ connected with mental health services

10 accessed residential addiction treatment

5 individuals gained employment

MAKING A DIFFERENCE, ONE PERSON AT A TIME

When a fire destroyed an older couple's trailer, they were left without a home. The Homeless Outreach team worked with several community agencies to coordinate services and secure a housing subsidy. A **Sources Housing Support Worker** assisted with finding a new home where the couple could stay together with their dog.

Anyone seeking detox and treatment must call daily to remain on the waitlists – an impossible requirement for one individual without access to a phone. **The Homeless Outreach team** made it possible to complete those calls, allowing the individual to keep their place and ultimately receive treatment.

Filing a tax return can be difficult without a fixed address or reliable access to a phone, yet it is essential for receiving GST credits, income supports and other benefits. Through tax support at the **Community Services Hub**, staff enabled nearly 20 people experiencing housing instability to complete their returns and access benefits they might otherwise have missed.

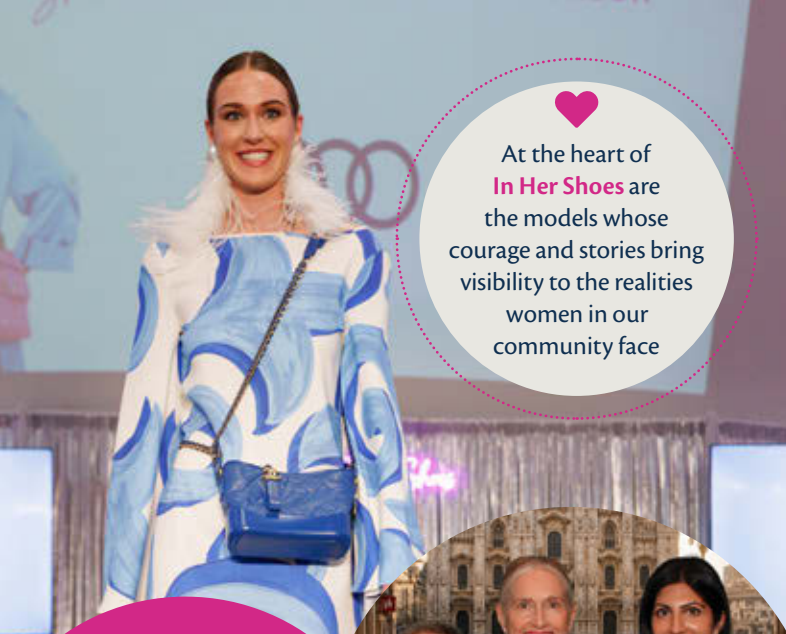

Impact Update: Foundry South Surrey-White Rock

Thanks to the generosity of donors and sponsors at the 2025 signature event, significant progress has been made toward bringing Foundry South Surrey-White Rock to our community. This year, the project reached a major milestone with the announcement of its home in the heart of White Rock and its official name, marking an important step towards creating a welcoming youth wellness centre. Planning and design continued to advance, guided by youth and family advisory committees, bringing the vision closer to reality. When completed, Foundry will provide integrated mental health, primary care, peer support and social services for young people and their families all under one roof.
